



Public Health Exclusion Requirements for High Risk Settings

Shigella	Exclude until: 1) 48 hours after resolution of diarrhea OR 2) until 24 hours after treatment with antibiotics has started <u>AND</u> it has been 24 hours after diarrhea stopped	Exclude until after resolution of diarrhea and two consecutive negative stools*	Exclude until after resolution of diarrhea and two consecutive negative stools*	Exclude until after resolution of diarrhea and two consecutive negative stools*

* The patient should be asymptomatic before stool is collected. Stools should be collected at least 24 hours apart. If patient is taking antibiotics, the first stool should be collected at least 48 hours after completion of antibiotic treatment.

High Risk Setting Definitions
Child Care Attendee: any child <5 years of age who attends any type of child care facility (including in-home & centers)
Child Care Provider: provides child care in any type of child care setting (including in-home providers & centers)
Healthcare Worker: provides patient care in any healthcare setting (including hospitals, medical clinics, pharmacy, long-term care facilities, etc.). This includes any staff providing services in a patient room (i.e., housekeeping and nutritionists).
Food Service Worker: works in a food manufacturing facility, restaurant or other food service facility in a food manufacturing, preparation, or serving capacity. This includes restaurant workers, food manufacturing facility workers, meat packing plant employees, and grocery/convenience store employees that prepare or serve food.
